HOMESHARE LAUNCH IN THE ACT



Community Connections Homeshare was launched in great style at the Canberra Hyatt on August 29th 2013.

ACT Minister for Disability Joy Burch did the honours and was clearly delighted that her department is supporting the Homeshare initiative.

Exec Director, Ian Ross and Homeshare Manager, Lee Harrison gave the background story to establishing Homeshare at Community Connections. Ian's own experience of homesharing with a householder with a disability in his university days was definitely an inspiration for his commitment to the homeshare idea.

Lee enthralled the audience by telling of the fantastic start that has been made in starting up Homeshare. In the first 8 months Lee has made 12 matches involving 10 householders (2 have been re-matched) and 8 matches are in place at the moment. A grand total of 143 weeks of homeshare in just 8 months – or, as Lee pointed out, 1001 nights!

THIS IS NOT HOMESHARE

At the HI conference one of the most inspirational presentations had little to do with Homeshare, except in that it embraced the same philosophy of mutual help between people with little expense and great outcomes. You need to know. Who can tell, one of you might like to introduce it in Australia.

The presenter was Professor Heinz Wolf, a man with an international reputation as an engineer, inventor and general wise person. You can look him up on the ubiquitous Google. Prof. Wolf is 86 and looks it until he starts speaking like an energetic 50 year old. He has decided at this stage of his life that what we need most is not another physical invention to help with the vagaries of ageing, but the power of a pair of hands.

His invention is CARE4CARE. The initiative is underpinned by the belief that the economic downturn is permanent and we cannot expect to maintain the sort of government professional support as we now experience. So we must help one another. Time given to help another person is recorded as an item in your hours of credit, for when you might need help yourself. You build up your 'bank' of hours by such services as getting breakfast for a housebound person, playing chess, help with dressing, hygiene or other less socially acceptable things. You can leave your hours in your will or credit them to a relative who may need them. Of course, you can see the problems that might arise, but with good will (as with Homeshare) it would work. Please look up www.care4care.org and see the good professor explain it himself.

THE NUTS AND BOLTS OF WORKING TOGETHER

The HANZA Community of Practice is rapidly becoming the useful forum for learning from each other that we had all hoped it would. The hard working HANZA team were immensely pleased to receive positive feedback from Ian Ross from ACT Community Connections after the September meeting: *PS. If we do not have time to cater for all your suggestions we will work on them during the coming year through CoPs. HANZA COM propose two topics:

- "Developing the Evidence Base for Pure Homeshare"
- "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet".

Members have already commenced discussion on the first topic via their participation in CoP, but there is still much to think about.

The second topic comes about from all the vigorous discussion that occurs within HANZA as we see that a word can be a "landmine". Harmless sounding words have implications as to where responsibility or jurisdiction lies. For example if the word "rent" is used in relation to a Homeshare agreement then it has implications for the householders insurance, it may affect their pension or benefits and involve the Tenancy Act.

To maximise member participation in this "name" debate, here is a list of words and terms. If you want to debate one or two let us know ASAP. It is best to choose something now as you all know the dangers of not volunteering. Here are the words and terms:

Volunteer. Rent. Sharer. Carer. Service. Agreement. Caregiving. Homesharing. Even one conference topic has a debatable term. "Pure Homeshare" other terms to consider are:

Full service homeshare. Partial Service Homeshare. Complete Service Homeshare. Active Service Model. Client Directed Service.

DISABILITY HOMESHARE

The ACT Government was in discussion recently with DisabilityCare about the services they fund in Canberra and called on Ian Ross, Executive Director, Community Connections, to provide some information about Homeshare.

Given the limited time Ian had to respond the information was put together pretty quickly using Community Connections original business case, and other documents to hand. Ian tells us that "policy is currently still being developed for Disability Care and I think we might benefit from developing a more considered HANZA submission promoting Homeshare, perhaps backed with some quantitative information about prevalence, numbers of people participating etc." This is an excellent suggestion that we will follow up with the HANZA members whose prime focus is on Disability Homeshare.
