


## Improving Lives and Communities by Bringing Vermonters Together to Share Homes

**WHAT:** HomeShare Vermont helps the State of Vermont meet two important goals by assisting our aging neighbors to stay at home, where they want to be, while simultaneously helping others find an affordable place to live.

**WHO:** While there are no age or income restrictions for homesharing, most people sharing their homes (homeshare hosts) are elders or persons with a disability while most people looking for housing (homeshare guests) can't afford market rents.

## FY 16 Return on Investment

In FY 2016 the State of Vermont provided \$77,545 of General Fund dollars (level funding since 2007) and \$102,395 of matching federal funds to HomeShare Vermont. This investment of state funding allowed Vermonters to save a total of over \$ 776,000.



Homeshare Guests provided approximately 26,208 hours of assistance to seniors and others. This represents a savings of nearly \$ 305,000 for those sharing their home and their families if they had to hire help. 1

By sharing their homes, low income seniors and others received over \$ 111,000 in rental income to help them make ends meet.

The average rent of a homesharing match was \$221 with 30% of matches paying \$0 rent. Using the difference between market rents and homeshare actual rents, it is estimated that HomeShare Hosts saved over \$471,000 in rental expenses.<sup>2</sup>

HomeShare Vermont currently provides service to Addison, Chittenden, Franklin and Grand Isle counties. Homesharing programs are few across the United States, and Vermont has the largest geographic coverage of any state in the country.
